



Do You Look After Someone?

Then you are a Carer. A carer is anyone who cares, **unpaid**, for a friend or family member who due to illness, disability, a mental health problem or an addiction cannot cope without their support. **Anyone can become a carer; carers come from all walks of life, all cultures and can be of any age.**

The Surrey NHS Carers Prescription

The Carer's Prescription is a secure online referral mechanism which allows doctors and other primary care health professionals to support carers they come into contact with by referring them to a range of support services available across Surrey. The support provided can be to the carer directly, or to the person being cared for. The purpose is to help support the health and wellbeing of the carer and improve the balance between their caring roles and their life away (alongside) from caring.

The following are the services available through the Carer's Prescription:-

- **Carer's Information including Surrey Digital Offer where email is provided**
- **Adult Carer's Support** - Action for Carers Surrey provide advice, information, support and advocacy to carers across Surrey.
- **Young Carer's Support** – Action for Carers Surrey host the Surrey Young Carer's Service which provides support for children and young people aged 5-24 years who look after someone.
- **Moving & Handling** – Action for Carers Surrey in partnership with White Lodge Centre provide specialist information, advice and training for those who undertake moving and handling as part of their caring role.
- **Carer's Assessment** - The assessment is an opportunity to discuss with a social care practitioner what support or services a Carer needs. The assessment will look at how caring affects the Carer's life, including for example, physical, mental and emotional needs, and whether they are able or willing to carry on caring. This is a Surrey County Council service.
- **Crossroads Care Surrey** provides a flexible home based care service for carers looking after family or friends. This includes free unlimited service for those caring for a loved one with a life limiting illness during the last year of their life. A palliative care trained Carer Support Worker will take over the caring role to give the unpaid Carer regular breaks.
- **Alzheimer's Society** provides free support and advice for Carers who care for people with dementia

What do we do with your information?

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Your Health, Borough/District Council and/or Voluntary Sector Professional will complete a Carer's Prescription referral form with you. On receipt of your Carer's Prescription, you will be contacted initially by a member of staff from Action for Carers Surrey to discuss your needs and what options are open to you. Should it prove necessary Action for Carers Surrey in turn may seek your approval to refer you on to Surrey County Council for a Carers Assessment, Crossroads Care Surrey and/or the Alzheimer's Society. Please note that any personal information provided in your referral form will be used solely for purposes of providing services listed above and the data is held securely in accordance with current Data Protection Legislation.

Our legal bases for processing information

We only process your personal information where it is lawful to do so.

The lawful basis on which Action for Carers process your information is 6(1) a: Consent. The separate condition for Action for Carers to process special category data is covered under Article 9(2) a: Consent.

Fair Processing Notice

In order to refer you to Carer's Services we need to collect some personal, confidential information.

How we use your information:

- Personal information provided in the referral will be solely for the purposes of providing services listed on the front side of this leaflet.
- The data without identifiers or personal information will be used to monitor activity and help service planning; this data does not identify individuals
- All data is held securely in accordance with current Data Protection Legislation

Your legal rights

You have the right to get a copy of the information that is held about you. This is known as a subject access request. This right of subject access means that you can make a request under current data protection legislation to any organisation processing your personal data. You can ask the organisation you think is holding, using or sharing the personal information to supply you with copies of both paper and computer records and related information. There is no charge for this service.

You also have the right to: ask an organisation to correct or erase your personal information; to object to them using your personal information in certain ways; to ask an organisation to restrict or suspend the use of your personal information; or to ask them to transfer your personal information to you or to another personal or organisation.

If you have given your consent to allow an organisation to use your personal information, you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time. If you no longer want a GP prescription, please notify the relevant organisations below.
