Do You Look After Someone?

Then you are a Carer. A carer is anyone who cares, unpaid, for a friend or family member who due to illness, disability, a mental health problem or an addiction cannot cope without their support. Anyone can become a carer; carers come from all walks of life, all cultures and can be of any age.

Carers are extremely important to the NHS, however, too often carers do not receive the recognition and support they need and deserve.

The NHS recognises and values your role as a Carer. We can offer you support by way of a Carers' Prescription. This will put you in contact with support services









The Surrey NHS Carers Prescription

The Carers' Prescription allows health staff to support carers they come into contact with by referring them to a range of support services across Surrey. The support can be provided to the carer directly, or to the person being cared for to help the carer improve the balance between their caring roles and their life away (alongside) from caring.

The following are the services available through the Carers' Prescription:-

Social Care: A referral to Surrey Country Council for advice, information and support, or to request a Carers' Needs Assessment.

Joint NHS and SCC Carers' Information Pack.

Carers' Emergency Card.

Surrey adult carers support the service provides independent information, advice and advocacy for Carers over 18 years irrespective of who they are caring for

Crossroads Care Surrey provides flexible home based care for carers looking after family or friends.

Crossroads End of Life Carers' Support offers a free unlimited service for those caring for someone with a life limiting diagnosis during the last year of their

Moving and Handling Service provides specialist advisors to give tailored information, advice and training to carers in their own homes on all aspects of moving and handling the person they care for.

Surrey Young Carers support carers under the age of eighteen

Giving Carers a Voice lobbies and campaigns to raise awareness of carers' issues.

Digital Offer: Our on line offer for carers to provide training, and support over the web

Military Carers Support Service is a dedicated service for armed forces families including existing service personnel and ex-service personnel (veterans)

Dementia Services offers free support and advice for Carers who care for someone who is suffering from dementia

TIHM for Dementia: A two-year clinical trial is being run to improve the lives of people with dementia and their Carers.
